Padre's Portion.... In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus shares with us the familiar and beloved parable of the mustard seed. The message is clear: to the very small to the very great, the growth is slow. God works quietly and clandestinely under the radar. It's God's work. There are so many examples of this slow growth in the Bible. Start with the birth of Jesus. Jesus sneaks behind enemy lines to be born in the dustiest, quietest place in Israel. No fanfare. The seed has been planted in a cave with only shepherds aware of the fact that the newborn king has been born. And there are other examples. Through St. Paul talked in Greece to the most important Greek scholars who walked away from him when Paul talked about the one true God in the shadow of the gods of Mt. Olympus. But a tiny handful did listen and the Church in Greece was born. Look at the Franciscans. Born 800 years ago one odd kid heard a voice from the Cross say, "Build My Church" and what happened was the most popular saint, St. Francis started a revolution of love. And of course our own Pope Francis who from the beginning wanted to guide our Church as a "field hospital" where all who come are taken care of. He has given us our signature song, "All Are Welcome." Then there's Mother Teresa. This little lady in Calcutta who heard the voice of Jesus to move out into the slums of the poorest city in the world and take care of the dying and the needy. With no money, no one to support her, her order of men and women is all over the world today. This and more is called the Mustard Seed Principle. God writes small, under the radar, and, in time, great things emerge. Look at your families, your children who continue to grow in the future generations. During this graduation season is the time to pause and see the miraculous work God continues to do. We are a Mustard Seed Parish!
